Exempts from the sales tax certain building materials, supplies, goods, wares, merchandise, or specified digital products sold, or services furnished, to a nonprofit organization whose primary activity is the construction of new, low-cost homes by incarcerated individuals for use by qualified persons in areas of the state in need of housing.
